About Us

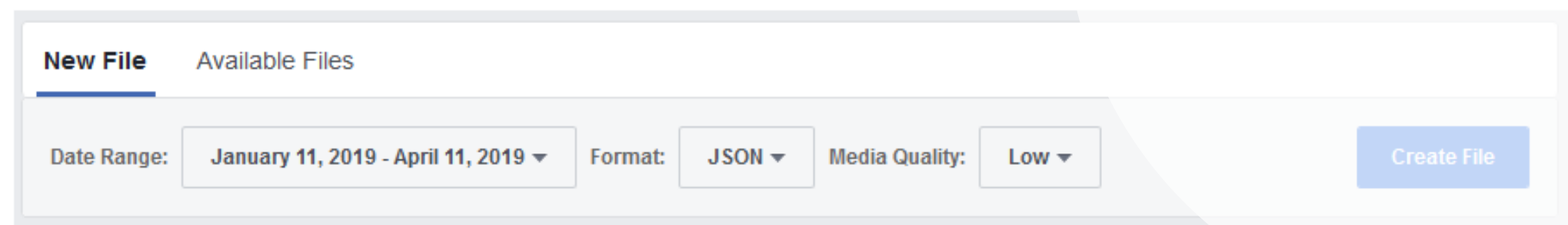

Make sure you select the 'JSON' format and the media quality resolution as 'low'.
