Re: Telecommunications (Infringement Notices) Guidelines 2024

The Australian Communications Consumer Action Network (**ACCAN**) thanks Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (**ACCC**) for the opportunity to comment on the ACCC Telecommunications (Infringement Notices) Guidelines 2024 Consultation Paper (**the Consultation Paper**).

ACCAN is the peak body that represents consumers on communications issues including telecommunications, broadband, and emerging new services. ACCAN provides a strong unified voice to industry and government as we work towards communications services that are trusted, inclusive and available for all.

ACCAN supports the ACCC's approach to the issuing of infringement notices as set out in the draft ACCC Telecommunications (Infringement Notices) Guidelines 2024 (**the Draft Guidelines**). However, we consider that the Draft Guidelines could be strengthened by amending section 8.4(b) to "there has been significant **harm or** detriment arising from the alleged conduct".¹

This will ensure consistency with subsections 8.2(c) and 8.3(c) and expand the instances in which an authorised officer may consider other forms of enforcement action appropriate in respect of an alleged contravention.
