Review of the Operational Matrices for Reporting on Accessibility Features for Telephone Equipment Industry Guideline

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a submission to Communication Alliance's review of this industry guideline.

ACCAN makes the following recommendations:

- 1. In recognition of the fact that the information in the Code can be difficult for consumers to obtain, Industry Code C625:2009 should include the directives that the information in G627:2009 must be made available:
 - a. To all retail outlets
 - b. To call centres
 - c. On the MMF site http://www.mobileaccessibility.info/
- 2. For both fixed line and mobile phones:
 - a. Mobility/dexterity features
 - i. The ability to easily turn off predictive text sending (as well as turn it on)
 - ii. 'Sticky keys' feature
 - b. Hearing features
 - i. Compatible with a separate vibrating alert facility
 - ii. Compatible with captioned telephony
 - iii. Compatible with Australia's Video Relay Service (via Skype)
 - iv. Compatible with Australia's National Relay Service's internet relay
- 3. For mobile phones:
 - a. Mobility/dexterity features
 - i. Easily manipulated recharging facility
 - b. Vision features
 - i. The current note under 'hearing features' re voice output of caller ID
 - should be under the 'vision features' heading
 - c. Hearing features
 - i. Conversion of voicemail messages to text
